







Hymnology: The Who, Why, When, Where, and How of What We Sing
```

Essential, I think, to our worship are the words and music of our liturgy and hymnody. For ages upon ages, we Christians have been singing songs of praise and prayer, hope and thanksgiving, longing and lament. We have grown up with worship books, perhaps with Mom or Dad holding the book so that we could follow along. That is likely how we began to learn musical notation.

Where do these hymns come from? Who writes them? Where did/do the authors live? When? Why do we sing them? How do the hymn texts speak to us? Who composes the music? How do the hymns get included in our worship books?

On the first three Sundays of February, during adult Sunday school, Glenn Petersen ("Pastor Glenn"), with the capable musicianship of Susan Bloomfield, will share a sample of hymn texts and tunes. There are so many to choose from. Come, as we explore the poetry, theology and music of what we sing.

GODLY PLAY

Learning Jesus in a New Way

Some of you have asked what our kids are learning about on Sunday mornings in Rock Ministry. There's not one simple answer to that because the content for each age group is suited to their unique learning needs. But to give you some insight, our youngest kids (age 3 through 2nd grade) use a curriculum titled "Godly Play" that was designed to help children engage scripture in hands-on and narrative-based ways. Godly Play works— to quote the famous song—from "2 to 92"... It has been used in prisons to convey parables to prisoners... and has been used at Mt. View since 2015.

Godly Play can be kind of mysterious... And full of wondering... Wondering is at the very heart of it all... "I wonder what this story might mean to you..." "I wonder what you liked best..." "I wonder if there is anything we could take out and still have the whole story..."

Some key components of this ethereal curriculum include:

-) It is Montessori-based, utilizing visual effects to enrich each Bible story as it unfolds before your eyes.
- It is child-focused. In other words, the adults while the kids are in the room are to remain at their level, saving adult conversations for before or after.
- During the heart of the story, the "story-teller" stays as immersed in the story as everyone else... He/she doesn't look up until it's time for wondering questions. Amazingly, if, as the story-teller, you discipline yourself into this practice, you truly become just a mouthpiece and the story comes as alive for you as for those who are, actually, listening. This practice has been found effective so that children aren't looking to the adult(s) for approval, but are to the best of their wiggly abilities drawn into what is unfolding before them...

The premise for Godly Play assumes—as per the primary architect/author, Dr. Jerome Berryman—that children already know God, simply needing "an appropriate language to construct their own personal meaning about that reality". "Intuitively", he has determined, "play seems... to be the way to help children learn and practice this language and to name and express what they already know... This invitation to come and play is based on what Jesus said about welcoming children and becoming like them."

Among the stories and content of Godly Play that we cover over a 2-3 year rotation is:

-) teaching from the Hebrew Scriptures like the story of the Ten Commandments and stories of the prophets
-) the parables of Jesus
-) stories of the risen Jesus and learning to know Jesus in a new way in the breaking of the bread, in doubt, in absence...
- learning about the "circle of the church year" (liturgical seasons)
-) and stories about the post-resurrection church

If you are still curious to hear—or see—more of what our kids are learning, you are invited to "Come and see" on a Sunday morning! The kids would love to have more adults join them in learning.

All are welcome. Recommended for middle school youth, high school youth, and adults.




