

MVLC INTERIM PASTOR

As members of Mountain View Lutheran Church, we currently find ourselves in a position of being "in between," an interim. Our long-term Senior Pastor John Vaswig has left, and now we are anticipating the calling of a permanent pastor in the next couple of years. As such, an interim pastor will be called by the Southwestern Washington Synod to assist our congregation in moving through this period of transition.

The Mountain View Lutheran Church Council has given our Synod the go-ahead to begin identifying available candidates who might be willing to serve our congregation. The Council indicated to Bishop Jaech and his assistant, Reverend Rebecca Shjerven, that Mountain View is looking for an individual who demonstrates solid theology, relevant preaching, transitional experience, and collaborative proficiency. The Council has stated that Mountain View desires a .75 FTE position.

The interim pastor will work closely with Pastor Glenn and Pastor Bri to augment their responsibilities at Mountain View. Once a potential interim has been identified by the Synod, a Transition Team comprised of the Church Council and other church members will interview and approve the candidate. If everyone is in agreement, our interim pastor could be in place within two months.

A presentation is being prepared by Church Administrator Phil Edlund and Treasurer Jason Cornell to inform congregational members of our financial responsibilities to such an individual. The meeting will most likely be held on Zoom. Look for coming announcements regarding the day, time, and meeting number.

Once chosen, an interim pastor may serve for a period of up to two years or more until a permanent pastoral candidate accepts Mountain View's call and is ready to arrive on our campus. A Call Committee will be assembled sometime next year from members of the congregation for the purpose of initiating the selection process under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Please continue to keep Mountain View's leadership, staff, and community in your prayers throughout this interim process.

As always, the Church Council welcomes your questions.

from "STAY HOME, STAY HEALTHY" to "SAFE START WASHINGTON"

As the "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" emergency measures end and we try to figure out how we will be able to return to worship and education on the MVLC campus, a team is being formed. Led by Sonja Dahl, the team will make recommendations on how to proceed forward. There are many documents available that are designed to provide guidance to churches, including those from the ELCA, the State of Washington, and the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department. The "Return to Worship" Team will consist of representation from ushers, the Altar Guild, staff, and musicians to take into the many aspects that are important in gather together again.

The following letter was received from SWWA Synod Bishop Jaech on May 27.

Dear Pastors, Deacons and Congregations,

Today at 2:30 p.m., Governor Inslee issued new guidelines for churches and religious organizations during this time of the COVID 19 pandemic.

You will read that the new guidelines are applied to counties according to their designation by the Governor as being in Phase 1 or Phase 2.

Our basic call as Christians is to love God and love our neighbor in all that we do. Spiritual care for the neighbor must be accompanied by physical care. Therefore, I strongly urge you to follow and not exceed these guidelines.

I continue to strongly recommend that congregations not rush to begin in-person gatherings, including the types of gatherings allowed by these new guidelines, without their leadership team carefully identifying and planning for all the logistical needs for safety. These needs are also stated in some detail in the Governor's statement.

EDGEWOOD NOURISH FOOD BANK

We have a new normal at the food bank since the Covid-19 pandemic began. Our distribution model has changed from self-selection to giving out prepacked boxes of food. So far, everyone is fine with the change and some of our customers have said they like it better because everything moves much faster.

When the "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" quarantine began, our volunteers did what they should, and stopped volunteering. At the end of March the National Guard came to the rescue. We have been fortunate enough to have six guardsmen working at the food bank four days per week. We will lose them mid-June. I am working on a plan to ask volunteers back when and if they feel safe.

We have gone from serving 300 families a week to about 550. So, far we have had enough food. God continues to provide through the hearts of our wonderful community and the federal and state government.

The best way for the congregation can support the food bank would be:

- We are really in need of about 2-3 healthy (no bad backs) volunteers to do grocery rescue pickups for the food bank. Please call the food bank if this is something you would be interested in hearing more about. 253-826-4654.
- Monetary donations. They are the most helpful right now because Nourish is able to buy truckloads of food for us at discounted prices.
- We have not been given permission to take food and product donations quite yet, although we will take food that has been purchased for the food bank. We let it sit for a few days and then distribute it.
- Helpful foods are all the shelf stable foods. Cereal and pasta are most needed right now. Shampoo and personal care products are also helpful.
- J In the next couple of weeks I will know how many volunteers I will need to keep the food bank running after the National Guard leaves. I will let Troy know so he can get the word out to you.

Thank you all for your continued support. Prayers for us to do God's will and for enough food and volunteers are always appreciated.

What a time we are living in right now. For my family this is a time for reflection and connection, but for so many others it means stress, isolation, and suffering. We know this pandemic will have a lasting impact for many years to come and will widen the gap between those that have strong relationships, resources, and support and those that do not. That is why the need to be a good neighbor and strengthen community will be needed now more than ever.

What keeps my spirits up is knowing that together, thanks to your support, Mountain View Community Center has maneuvered to make the greatest impact we can now, while visioning and keeping the future needs of our community in mind.

Here are some ways we are *currently* continuing to support the community:

- / Kid PowerPacks, or weekend food packs, are now being distributed to 600 children weekly. This is more than double the amount of children we are serving prior to covid-19.
- The Good Neighbor Fund has been created to support families impacted by job or income loss with monetary support for essential needs like housing, utilities, food, and childcare. 100% of donations to this fund go directly to our neighbors in need. Please see our website for more information.
- Online Senior Fitness Videos led by our fitness instructor, Loy Vincent, are posted on our website and we are organizing individual wellness calls and delivery of care packages to keep our seniors active and healthy.
- Community Resources are being collected and organized onto one central document on our website. We are using our Facebook page to share opportunities and resources daily.

I am happy to announce that out team is growing! Josh Shulkind has accepted the position of Programs Manager and begins this month. He will not only help us run our current programs more efficiently but comes with the experience and passion to help us plan for future programming, specifically to meet the needs that will develop due to the financial, educational, and emotional strain of this pandemic. He looks forward to meeting you all!

It is my promise to you that Mountain View Community Center will continue to be a beacon of hope, a place for connection, and a good neighbor to each of you. Thank you for your continued support which fuels our vision of a community in which all experience belonging and wellness in the spirit of Christ's love.

CHURCH ADMINISTRATOR

Online Worship, Education, and Events

At the beginning of March (the last time we published a full newsletter) who could have imagined that Mountain View (and all other churches) would be thrust into the world of online worship, education, and events *in less than one week!* We never missed any Sunday Worship, and we only had a one-week gap in Adult Education, after we suspended onsite worship. Additionally, the church staff adjusted to working mostly from home.

Fortunately, Mountain View invested in many new technologies over the last six years, which made our transition fairly seamless!

2014

Phone system replaced in preparation for relocating our offices for the *Former Things, New Things* Building Project. The new system allows our office phones to connect to the church remotely from home, so that calls are still answered, and transferred to others/voicemail just as if we were in the office.

2015

Replaced sound console with a digital one (funded by a grant from the Mission Endowment Fund) which enables us to create better sound quality on the video recordings for worship, by allowing adjustments via an iPad next to the camera operator.

2018

J Replaced on-site church management software with a cloud-based version

2019

- J Replaced on-site church financial & payroll systems with a cloud-based version
-) Replaced on-site file servers, library software, and email with cloud-based versions
- Installed Wi-Fi thermostats, that are managed by our church management software calendars

2020

) Launch of new Online Giving Platform, including "Text to Give", and launch of ShelbyNEXT Membership and Ministry One mobile apps.

All these investments helped us better equip you and our ministries when on-site and equipped us to continue ministry in new ways during the COVID-19 "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" emergency measures!

We thank you for your continued faithful participation in our ministry and mission, your continued faithful financial support, and your patience as we all learned together about online worship production, Zoom meetings, and more!




